### **CHANGE TO WEDNESDAY'S SCHOOL DINNER**

## Newsletter

We have reached the end of our last full week in Reception! This time of year is always so bittersweet as we stand back and revel in all of the things the children have learned and can do, how independent they have become and how they are getting ready for the next chapter of their journey; however the time to say goodbye always comes around so very quickly!

In Drawing Club this week, we have enjoyed the book ‘Rosie’s Walk.’ The children have really come into their own with their drawing and writing, showing lots more independence and imagination.

We will be collecting in the children’s reading books before we finish for summer so please do continue to send book bags into school so we can do this next week in readiness to check our stock over the Summer - thank you.
