EARRINGS SHOULD NOT BE WORN ON PE DAYS. PLEASE MAKE SURE ALL ITEMS ARE LABELLED.

SCHOOL MEAL COST INCREASE = £2.70

From September, the cost of school meals will increase to £2.70. This is an increase passed on to us by our provider due to increase in prices affecting them. Remember to consider whether your child would be eligible for a free school meal through pupil premium funding.

Contact the office for further eligibility information, if required. School meals for the week/half term should be paid for in advance using the school gateway payment system.

UNIFORM

Please clearly mark all items of clothing with your child's name:

Plain white shirt (short-sleeve preferred) and school tie (navy and bottle green); grey skirt or pinafore or trousers; navy with bottle green trim school cardigan or V-neck jumper with logo; grey socks or plain grey tights; flat black shoes (not trainers or open toe / heel sandals) and bottle green or navy blue hair tie or ribbons or bands. Only plain gold or silver studs - no shapes, patterns or gems.

Until the end of the Autumn 1st Half Term the following may be worn: Grey tailored shorts, plain white shirt or blouse or polo shirt (short-sleeve) or green & white summer dress with long or short white socks.

Green school book bag - for homework etc that must fit in child's tray – no back packs please as there is insufficient space to house them safely

CHILD ABSENCE AND BELONGINGS

If your child will be absent from school, for whatever reason, please make sure you have contacted the school office **before 9am on their 1st day of absence.**

Please make sure that every item of your children's belongings are labelled with their name and class as this is the only way we will be able to return these items to them if misplaced. Please send your child to school with all the items they require for the day: water bottle (just containing water - no juice), packed lunch if required and a waterproof coat every day to allow us to go outside, even in inclement weather.
