It has been another busy week with a full timetable in Reception! The children are coping brilliantly with their new routines and working hard during our short teaching inputs.

Phonics

In Phonics we have now learned our first ten letters and are working on our oral blending. So for instance, knowing that c-a-t is cat.

Maths

In our Maths fluency lessons we have been 'using our eyes to subitise' with amounts to two. Subitising is the ability to look at a small number of objects and instantly recognise how many objects there are without needing to count.

In our Maths groups we have been looking at similarities and differences in groups of items. The children approached using their Maths journals with gusto and were able to match pairs of ladybirds by the number of spots on their backs and objects by their intended use.


During lockdown we have found that the children's spelling ability was greatly impacted as it was difficult to teach and test spellings virtually.

- A paper copy of the preference form can also be requested from <u>schooladmissions@halton.gov.uk</u> or at any Halton Direct Link Office
- All online applicants will receive their offer of a school place electronically on the 1st March 2024
- Offer letters will be posted to applicants who submit a paper preference form on 1st March

- Don't leave it too late you are likely to miss out on the school place you want if you apply late. <u>Deadline is 31st October 2023</u>

STARTING SECONDARY SCHOOL – SEPTEMBER 2024 ADMISSION TO SECONDARY SCHOOLS FOR HALTON RESIDENTS

As your child is due to transfer from primary to secondary school in September 2024, we are pleased to advise that the Admission to Secondary School 2024 booklet which explains the arrangements is now available online at <u>School admissions website</u>

It is highly advised that you read this booklet, and then complete the online application available at <u>School admissions website</u>. If any of your preferred schools are in other local authority areas you will need to visit their websites for details on the admission policies and oversubscription criteria. If you are unable to apply online, then please email schooladmissions@halton.gov.uk, or drop into one of the Halton Direct Link Offices to obtain a form or call us on the numbers above.

The timetable for Secondary School admissions is as follows:

September 2023	Admission to Secondary School booklet available online. Online applications open
31 st October 2023	Closing date for receipt of preference forms and online applications
1 st March 2024	Notification of outcome of preference available online, to those who applied online, and letter posted to parents of paper applicants
29th March 2024	Closing date for submission of intention to appeal

You should read the booklet carefully, and think about how your child's application will be considered against each of your preference school's oversubscription criteria before indicating that school as a preference. Failure to submit an application may result in the Local Authority being unable to allocate a place for your child at your preferred school.





It is important that you make as many preferences as possible (up to the maximum of 3) to increase your chances of being offered a school of your preference. It is sometimes not possible to offer any of a parent's preferred schools and in these circumstances your child will be allocated a place at the nearest school with vacancies by the Local Authority.

However, this will not affect your right of appeal to an independent appeals panel against the decision not admit your child to your school(s) of preference and details on these procedures will be given to you at that time. If you require any further information please contact a member of the School Admissions Team on the telephone numbers above or by email.

Please note: There is no first-come-first-offered basis for applications. All applications received are considered against the oversubscription criteria for the school. The important thing to do is to make sure that you complete the online application, or submit a paper application form on-time, before the deadline of 31st October 2023. If your child was born between 01/09/2019 and 31/08/2020, or if you requested a deferred entry to primary school and that has been agreed for your child for September 2024, they are eligible to commence Primary School in September 2024. We are pleased to advise that the Admission to Primary School 2024 booklet which explains the arrangements is available online at <u>School admissions website</u>

It is highly advised that you read this booklet, and then complete the online application available at <u>School admissions website</u>. If any of your preferred schools are in other local authority areas you will need to visit their websites for details on the admission policies and oversubscription criteria. If you are unable to apply online, then please email the School Admissions Team, or drop into one of the Halton Direct Link Offices to obtain a form.

The timetable for Primary School admissions is as follows:

September 2023	Admission to Primary School booklet available online. Online applications open
15 th January 2024	Closing date for receipt of preference forms and online applications
16 th April 2024	Notification of outcome of preference available online, to those who applied online, and letter posted to parents of paper applicants
16 th May 2024	Closing date for submission of intention to appeal

You should read the booklet carefully, and think about how your child's application will be considered against each of your preference school's oversubscription criteria before indicating that school as a preference. Failure to submit an application may result in the Local Authority being unable to allocate a place for your child at your preferred school.







It is important that you make as many preferences as possible (up to the maximum of 3) to increase your chances of being offered a school of your preference. It is sometimes not possible to offer any of a parent's preferred schools and in these circumstances your child will be allocated a place at the nearest school with vacancies by the Local Authority. However, this will not affect your right of appeal to an independent appeals panel against the decision not admit your child to your school(s) of preference and details on these procedures will be given to you at that time. Please note: There is no first-come-first-offered basis for applications. All applications received are considered against the oversubscription criteria for the school. The important thing to do is to make sure that you complete the online application, or submit a paper application form on-time, before the deadline of 15th January 2024.
