Alongside the standard food parcel, food banks try to provide other essential non-food items to adults and children in crisis.


The list sets out what food banks generally need the most, but please always check with your local food bank before donating to see what supplies they are currently most in need of.

- Household items laundry liquid detergent, laundry powder, washing up liquid
- Feminine products sanitary towels and tampons
- Baby supplies nappies, baby wipes and baby food



We have had another busy week in Reception and even though we are coming to the end of our first half term and the children are tired, they are still working hard and making sound progress with their learning.

#### Phonics

This week in phonics we have looked at the sounds of v, y, w, x and z. #### Maths

In our Maths fluency lessons we have been practising our subitising skills again with numbers three and four. We then represented three and four in various ways using a range of concrete resources.

In our Maths lessons we have enjoyed immersing ourselves in pattern! Lots of our challenges in provision have been based around simple repeating patterns and the children have become increasingly confident at describing and continuing these.



#### 'What makes a family?'

In our Topic lessons our Big Question has been 'What makes a family?' The children have enjoyed sharing who they live with but then also members of their wider family. It has been lovely getting to know all about the important people in their lives!
