LIVERPOOL MUSEUM'S STRIKE

Due to the Liverpool Museum Strike unfortunately changes have been made to Year 1's Synagogue trip and Year 4's trip to the World Museum has been postponed.

YEAR 1 = SYNAGOGUE AND ANGLICAN CATHEDRAL VISIT - TUESDAY 5TH MARCH

The children in Year 1 will now be visiting the Synagogue and Anglican Cathedral during Tuesday's visit, we apologise for this change but it enabled us to proceed with the Synagogue visit. This will allow them to compare the features of these two religious buildings, identifying the similarities and differences. The children should come in school uniform and will require a packed lunch and a waterproof coat. If your child requires a school packed lunch please contact the office directly.

Class 6L will be participating in their Bikeability sessions next week between Monday 4th March and Thursday 7th March next week. 




We have enjoyed our dance sessions with Miss Valentine using different movements, levels and being creative.


