In Drawing Club this week, we have enjoyed the book 'Superworm.' The children have really come into their own with their drawing and writing, showing lots more independence and imagination.


Caterpillars

During our trip, class 4L showed a wonderful amount of curiosity and enthusiasm to learn something new and discover the secrets about the Ancient Egyptians.




In Science, we have been developing our listening skills and learning all about sound and how it travels on vibrations. We used our enterprising skills to make cup phones and listen to each other at different distances.
