MATHEMATICS

In our Maths fluency lessons the activities have focused on comparison, developing this innate skill as the children have been encouraged to look carefully and use the language of comparison to describe sets of objects that they can see. We have used the language of 'more than' and 'fewer than' to describe how many objects there are in each set. 'Fewer than' is used rather than 'less than' because the focus is on countable things.

In our Maths groups we have really enjoyed exploring simple repeating patterns with lots of different concrete apparatus, ourselves and even with musical instruments! The children have taken this through to their independent learning and we have seen lots of repeating patterns being produced around provision.



'BIG QUESTION'

Our 'Big Question' this week has been 'How can I look after myself?'. We have been working on lots of self-care skills such as putting on our coats, changing our shoes to our wellies, washing our hands and using a knife and fork. We can already see the difference this has made to the children's independence.

ZOO LAB

We started the week with a bang thanks to our visit form Zoo Lab. We loved getting hands on with the animals and learning how they use their senses.
