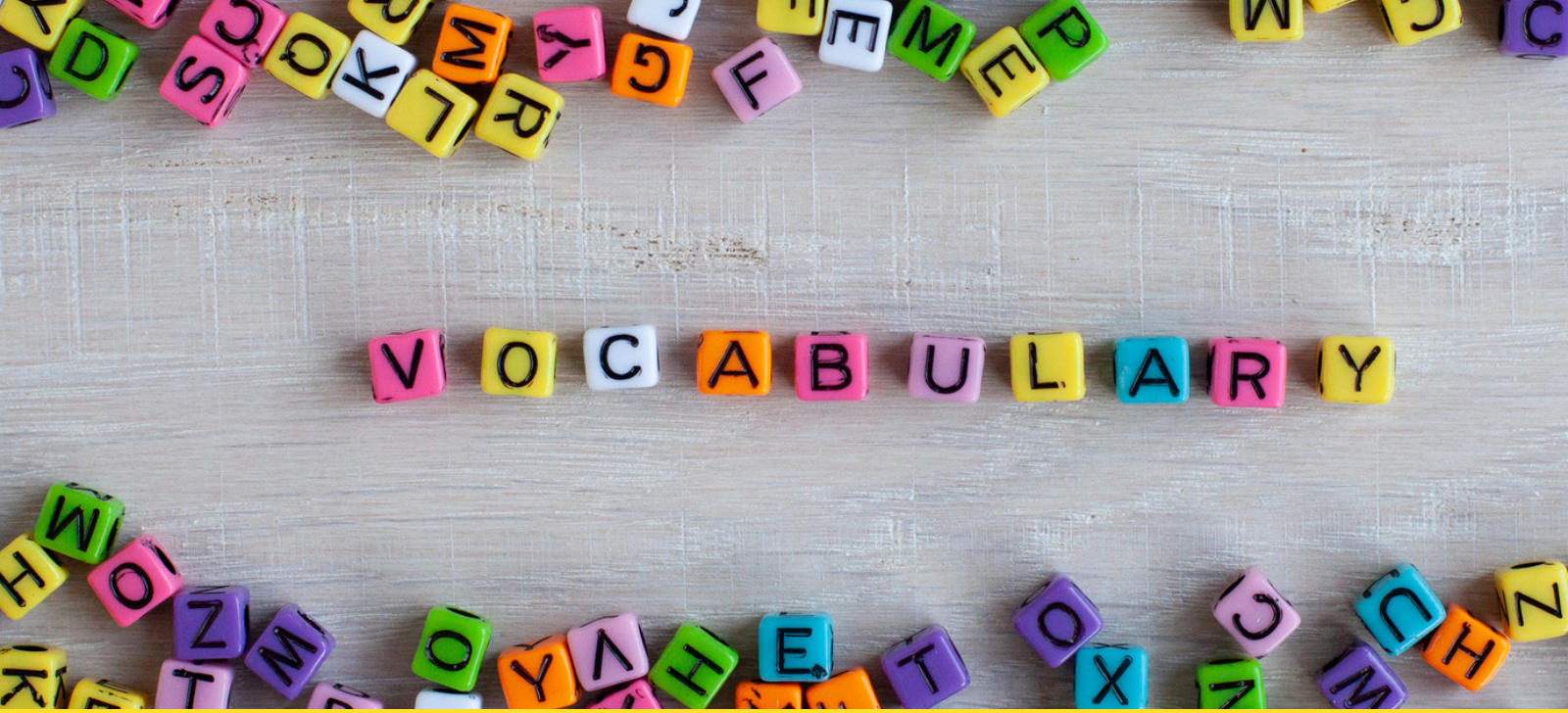

## BREAKTIME SNACKS



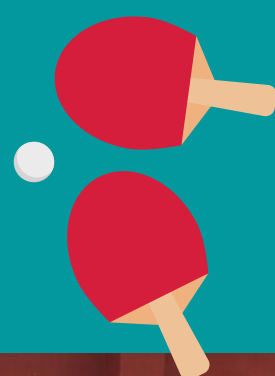

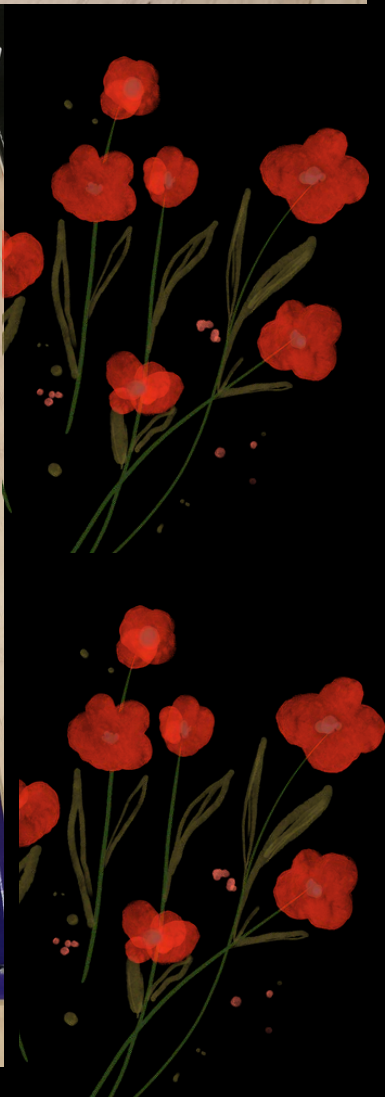






# Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal

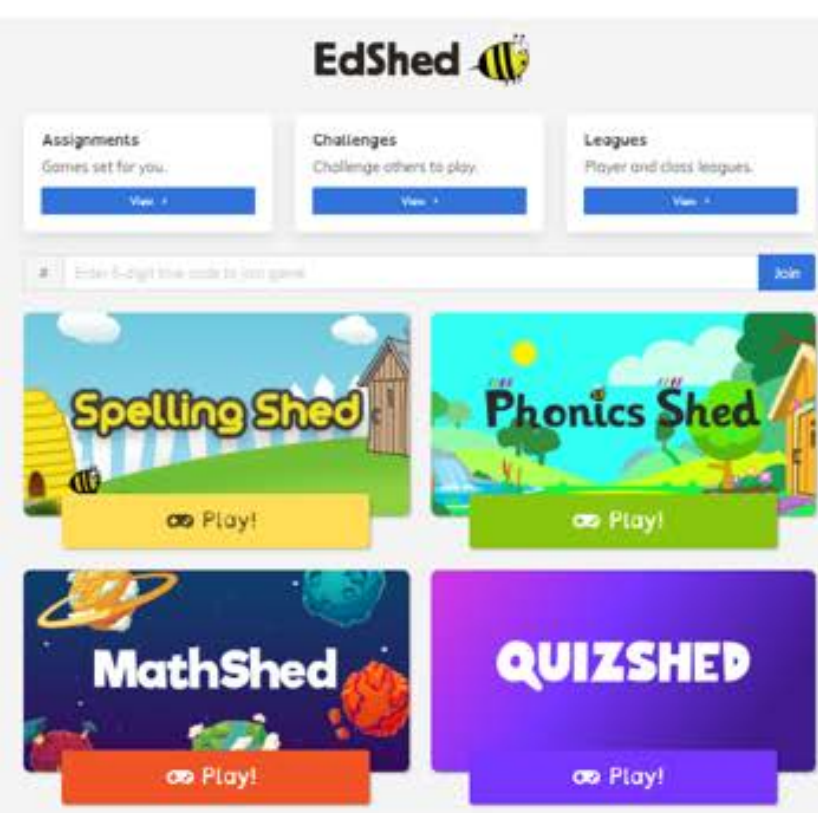
# Spelling and Phonics Shed
