



BREAKTIME SNACKS

From Monday to Thursday children must only bring healthy snacks ie; fruit, cheese, vegetables, oat bars (No chocolate, nuts, crisps (as a snack).

On Fridays they may bring a NUT-FREE treat such as Kit Kat or bag of crisps but NOT hardboiled sweets, chewy sweets, lollipops, sherbet, chewing gum etc.

We have been concerned this half term by the size of the snack that children are bringing into school on a Friday. These should be small/regular sized items as they will be eating their lunch soon after morning break. Free fruit is always available for all Key Stage 1 children.
