Who travels to the moon?

Our Big Question this week has been 'Who travels to the moon' We have talked about the job of an astronaut and learned about the life of Neil Armstrong and why he is famous. Through stories we have seen clues telling us that Neil Armstrong lived in the past such as the style of planes he used to fly. The children asked some great questions about his life. We even shared some examples of space food and thought about what it would be like to travel to the moon and live in space.



Mathematics

In Maths this week the children have been exploring 2D shapes in more depth by learning to recognise and name them in different orientations, describing their properties to 'guess the mystery shape' and creating pictures using Tangrams.

In our Maths fluency sessions we have revisited our work on doubling numbers. The children understand that both 'parts' must be equal for it to be a double. Some of us are really developing our ability to recall doubles of numbers to five!

Writing

There was a great buzz in Early Years on Tuesday afternoon when one of the toilets wasn't working! It resulted in lots of excitement and was a fantastic mark making and writing opportunity with the children drawing and writing on post-it notes to create signs warning their friends not to use the toilet in question!
