STIRKE ACTION - WEDNESDAY 5TH JULY AND FRIDAY 7TH JULY

The upcoming strike days have been set by the NEU teachers' union for Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7th July. Lunt's Heath Primary School will remain open for all classes on both of these strike days. Year 6 will return to Lunt's Heath on Wednesday 5th July from their High School Transition.

LUNT'S HEATH TRANSITION

On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday next week the children will participate in transition to their new classes and teachers. The children should come to school as usual on Monday and they will be transported to their new class by their current teacher. They should be collected from their current class as usual on Monday. On Tuesday and Wednesday the children will start and end their days in their new classroom. Please see separate letter for specific arrangements for each class. Year 6 will participate in high school transition and should refer to specific arrangements from their new high school. Year 6 will return to Lunt's Heath on Wednesday due to High School strike days they will go to the school hall.

NEW EYFS CLASS TRANSITION

Children in our new EYFS class have been invited to school on Monday or Tuesday next week to participate in a Teddy Bear's Picnic. 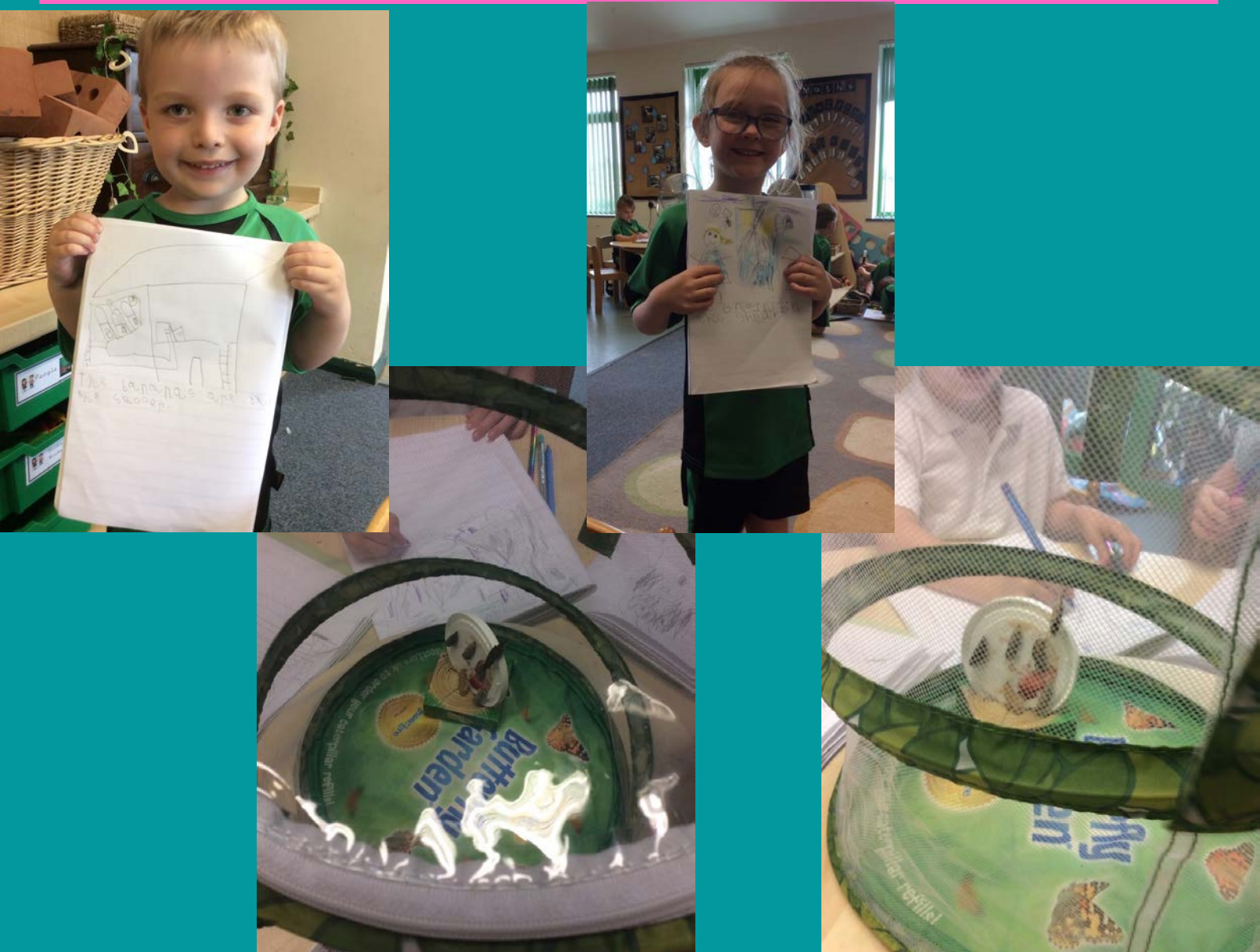

There has been much excitement and squeals of joy and amazement this week as our beautiful butterflies have started to emerge from their chrysalises! This has really helped with the children's understanding of life cycles and will hopefully be something they always remember!

“Why do ladybirds have spots?”

Our Big Question this week has been ‘Why do ladybirds have spots?’ We have enjoyed the story of ‘The Bad-Tempered Ladybird’ by Eric Carle and the children were inspired to apply their writing skills to speech bubbles, recording what the ladybirds were saying. We again discussed the difference between fiction and non-fiction texts before exploring an information text about ladybirds where we learned that their spots help warn predators not to eat them.



Mathematics

In Maths this week we have been learning about data handling. We have explored, created and interpreted data from pictograms and have also discovered how tally marks can help us when gathering data too.

Drawing Club

In Drawing Club this week we have enjoyed watching an episode of ‘Bananaman.’ The children have thought of some really imaginative ideas for a superhero hide out and different locations that Bananaman could hide his bananas from his enemies!

Just a reminder that the children are welcome to bring a named water bottle into school each day. We always have fresh water available on the snack table but it is easier for the children to keep a drink with them in the classrooms during this warm spell if they have their own bottles too, thank you.

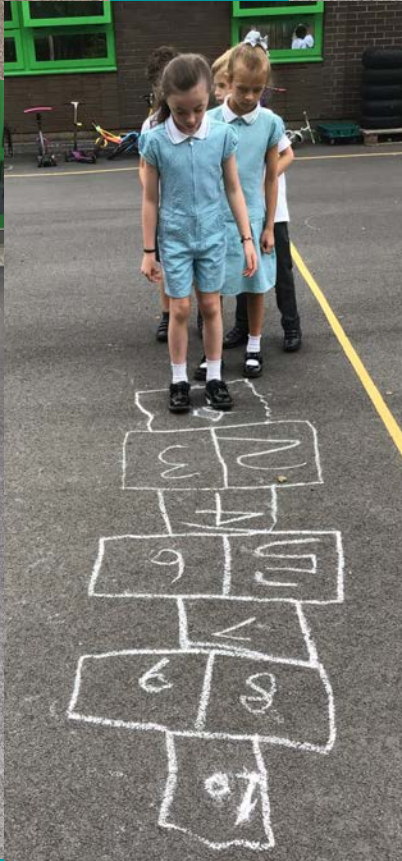
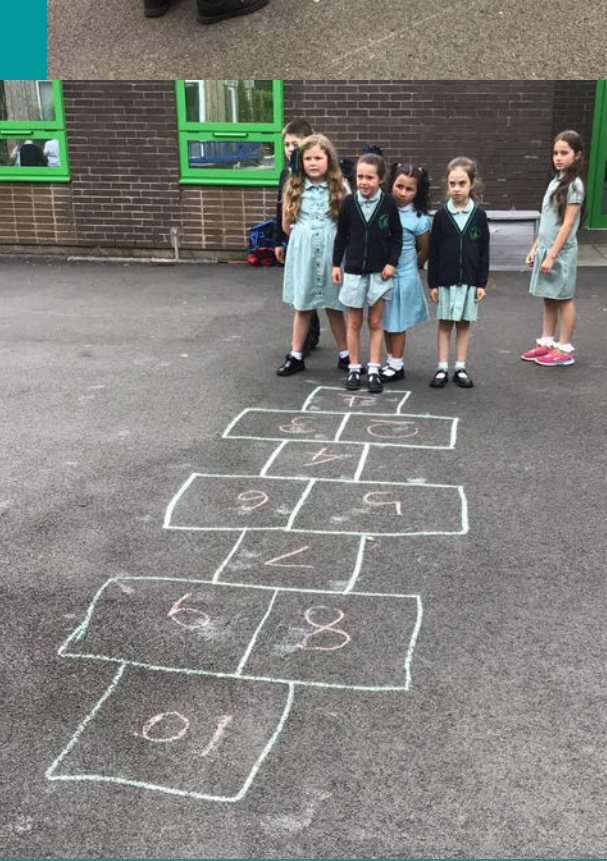
MUSIC FESTIVAL

This week, the children in Year 1 went on a local area walk. They identified the features of a village and then created their own maps showing the features of Farnworth.

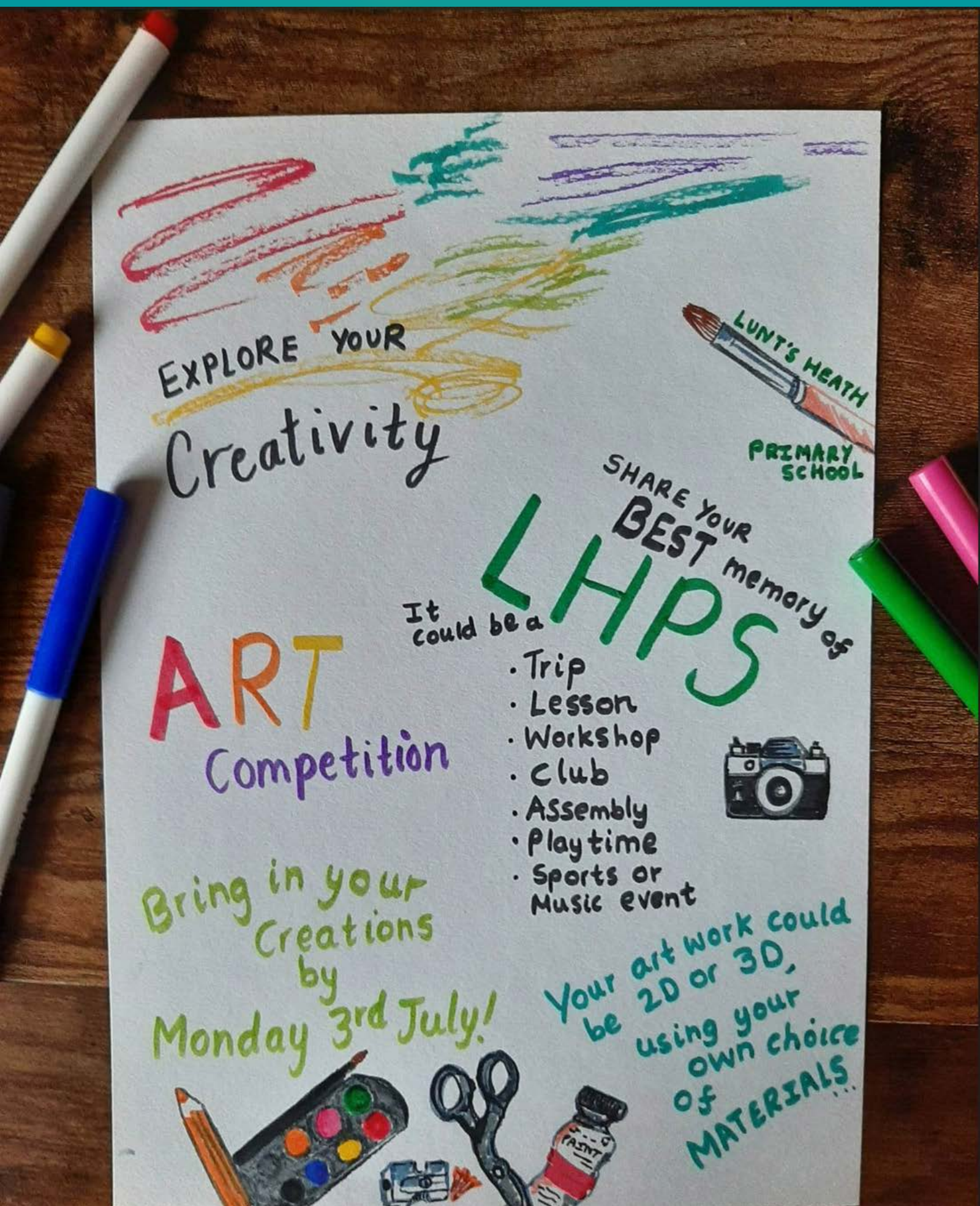


GARDENING CLUB

Spelling and Phonics Shed

Just a reminder that the Lunt's Heath PTA have funded a subscription for every child to not only Maths Shed but the platform which also includes Spelling and Phonics Shed.

During lockdown we have found that the children's spelling ability was greatly impacted as it was difficult to teach and test spellings virtually.

Spelling shed allows the children to practice their spellings for their age phase in a fun and interactive way through games.

Encourage your child to log into their account, select Spelling Shed or Phonics Shed. Choose their age phase and then they can choose the game type and level of challenge.
