We have enjoyed the story of 'The Bad-Tempered Ladybird' by Eric Carle and the children were inspired to apply their writing skills to speech bubbles, recording what the ladybirds were saying. We again discussed the difference between fiction and non-fiction texts before exploring an information text about ladybirds where we learned that their spots help warn predators not to eat them.

In gardening club, the children enjoyed finding weeds and taking them out in the Early Years garden and woodland.




























The New School Year
