- Toiletries deodorant, toilet paper, shower gel, shaving gel, shampoo, soap, toothbrushes, tooth paste, hand wipes
- Household items laundry liquid detergent, laundry powder, washing up liquid
- Feminine products sanitary towels and tampons
- Baby supplies nappies, baby wipes and baby food



This week in phonics we have looked at the sounds sh, th and ch. It was very exciting and a little bit different as it was our first encounter of 'special friends'. Special friends are digraphs so they have two letters that make the one sound.




Maths

In our Maths fluency lessons we have been exploring the language of more and fewer. We have explored lots of different visual representations of quantities and the children have been encouraged to justify how they know which set has more or fewer.

In our Maths lessons we have been working in depth with numbers to five: working on our numeral formation, matching numeral to quantity and ordering forwards and backwards. Lots of fun was had as we completed our Maths journals, pretending to be rockets, counting backwards and then blasting off to space!

As an OPAL school we aim to provide the children with more space to play and more things to play with. Developing their imaginations and problem solving skills through play.




