*"School council met up as a group for the first time this week to briefly discuss our role in school. I was so proud to meet all of our representatives and we can't wait to work on ideas to help make our school even better.*

*Our school council is a formal group of pupils who act as representatives of their classmates in discussing school issues with the headteacher and staff. It's a brilliant way of representing and contributing to Pupil Voice in our school. Students are elected to represent the views of all pupils and also to improve their school. "School council" means all kinds of school-based groups run by our pupils. We will help to make decisions about how the school is run and take on projects that support the children's learning and development, such as organising charity events, representing the school at outside events, helping to ensure everyone is safe in school or ensuring the school is environmentally friendly. School councils were elected by the other children. Our school council will meet with a teacher or our headteacher to discuss and sort out problems or give ideas for a project. These could include school lunches, behaviour or ideas for fundraising events. We hope that we can represent Lunt's Heath School to the best of our ability."*

### Dogs, bikes and scooters.

Bicycles and scooters must not be ridden by children or adults on the school site.

Please note that for reasons of health and safety including safeguarding children no dogs are allowed on school site and should not be left tied up and unattended on the school fence. Whilst our pets are special to us can I request we remain mindful of children who are scared of dogs and if we have a dog with us, possibly standing on the opposite side of the road away from the school gate or fence so children feel safer when they walk along the school pavement through the gates.

### Drop off and pick up

As the afternoons are getting darker, please remember to contact the office if someone different is collecting your child from school. Teachers look for the correct adult when they are returning your child to you and this is harder to do in reduced light. This makes it more important than ever to know if they should be looking for a different adult to enable us to keep your child safe.

All children need to be collected by an adult after an after school clubs as the evenings are getting darker. This includes Year 6, who may have a walking pass for the end of the school day but need to be collected by an adult following a club.






