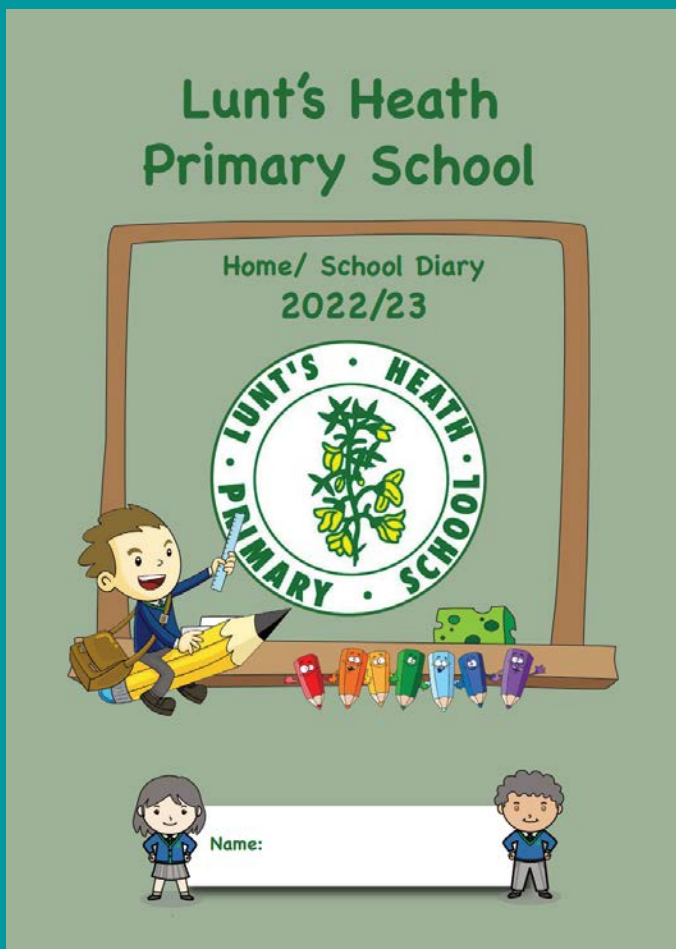

English Skills 1	
Here are some important things to know that will help you to improve your writing	
<b>NOUN:</b> A noun is the word used to identify a person, place, object, or idea. Common nouns refer to any of the above, whereas proper nouns refer to any particular person, place or idea. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> Common Noun: glass, pen, girl. Proper Noun: Peter, Wigan.	
<b>PRONOUN:</b> A pronoun is a word used in the place of one or more nouns. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> It was almost noon when she was able to ask her friend if she had seen him.	
<b>ADJECTIVE:</b> An adjective changes a noun or pronoun. It describes the colour, shape, size, what kind and how many. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> A young woman was buying an expensive scarf.	
<b>VERB:</b> A verb is a word that expressed action or state of being. The tense of the verb shows the time of the action or state. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> I touch the window (present tense). I touched the window (past tense). I will touch the window (future tense).	
<b>ADVERB:</b> An adverb is used to modify a verb, an adjective or another adverb. It expresses where, when and how much. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> The woman walked quickly (modifies walked). She was very beautiful (modifies the adjective beautiful). The truck moved too slowly (modifies the adverb slowly).	
<b>PREPOSITION:</b> A preposition shows the relationship between a noun or pronoun and the rest of the sentence, making the meaning clearer. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> The car pulled up alongside the truck.	
<b>CONJUNCTIONS:</b> Conjunctions join words or groups of words. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> Bring your dog to show and you could enter the competition.

Punctuation Skills	
Here are some important things to know that will help you to improve your writing	
<b>FULL STOP (.)</b> Place a full stop at the end of a sentence that is not a direct question or exclamation. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> He walked quickly past the door.	
<b>COMMA (,)</b> Use a comma to show a natural pause in a sentence or to separate three or more items in a list. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> No, there are no more seats left today. I bought a new hat, scarf, gloves and bag.	
<b>SEMI-COLON (;)</b> Use a semi-colon to connect independent clauses in a compound sentence. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> There were too many eggs in the mixture; the cake was bound to sink.	
<b>COLON (:)</b> Use a colon before a list of items or an explanation or an example. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> I bought these items today: onions, tomatoes, peppers and potatoes.	
<b>QUOTATION MARKS (")</b> Use quotation marks to show direct speech. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> "Here you are!" he said. "I wondered what had happened to you."	
<b>APOSTROPHES (')</b> Use apostrophes where letters have been omitted or to indicate possession. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> It'll (I will) go to the shops later today. That is the dog's blanket.	
<b>EXCLAMATION MARK (!)</b> Use exclamation marks at the end of a sentence to show emotion such as anger, surprise or joy. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> There was a loud bang!	
<b>HYPHEN (-)</b> Use a hyphen to join two words or to divide a word that runs over from one line to the next. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> brand-new	
<b>QUESTION MARK (?)</b> Use a question mark at the end of a sentence to show that you are asking a question. <b>EXAMPLE:</b> Do you like pasta?

## Homework

As the children get older homework, will encourage them to develop the confidence, self-discipline, and independence needed to study on their own. Throughout the school there will be a focus on English and Mathematics with other subjects gradually being introduced as children move into Key Stage 2. As this type of homework will be related to ongoing class activities children should be able to complete the work without any difficulty. Please remember that homework is owned by the children thus the work should be principally theirs.

The children will be set homework on a Tuesday and will have a week to complete this online. By completing the work online it allows the teachers to analyse the work that they could not complete and then target interventions to support your child moving forward. If your child has particular difficulty with a piece of homework or cannot complete a piece of work for any reason then please use the homework diary to let their class teacher know.

We have redesigned our homework diaries as reading records to act as a communication book between home and school. This has extra information to support your and your child, including our home school agreement / code of conduct, spellings, reading skills, mathematical skills and key vocabulary. Please listen to your child read on a daily basis and record this in the reading record section. The children will write their homework in the homework section. Please write messages to your child's class teacher in the homework diary and sign this on a weekly basis. The teacher will sign this on a weekly basis too and respond to messages from you. Homework for Year 1-3 will be set on Maths / Spelling and Quiz Shed which the children can access by following the link below and logging in to access the assignment section of their class page.

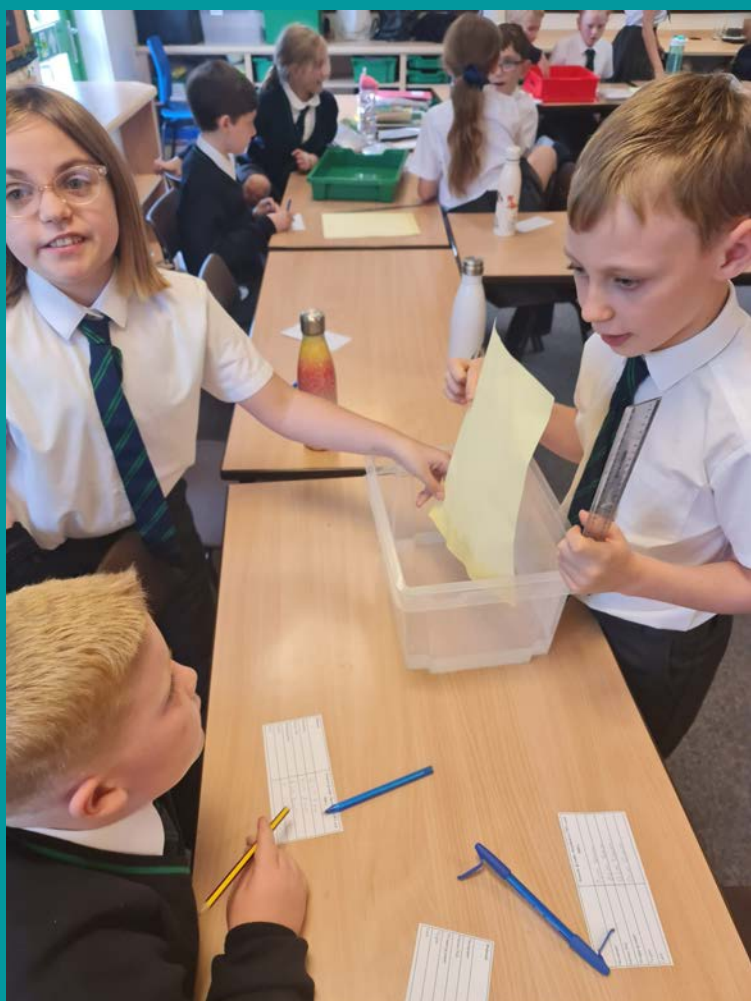
## YEAR 2 ENGLISH

# FOREST SCHOOL

*Forest School is an inspirational process that offers children and young people opportunities to achieve confidence and self-esteem, through a 'hands on' learning experience in the school woodland.*



## Y1 OUTDOOR LEARNING

*Outdoor Learning happens through learning about the environment in which the activity and experience takes place. It covers the acquisition or refinement of specific knowledge and skills...that can lead to increased health and wellbeing, and environmental awareness. 




